Teachers can either book an incursion with AYF or run their own lesson using our web based resources. We thank Telethon for sponsoring the printing of these workbooks.




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

Detect & Protect with Buddy

Sing this song 3 times in your head (to the tune of Row, Row, Row Your Boat). That is how long you need to wash your hands. Wash the top and bottom of your hands and in-between your fingers and thumb.

Wash, wash, wash your hands

Rub and scrub them clean

Count to twenty That is plenty

Remember in-between.





Cough and sneeze into your elbow— not your hands. The respiratory droplets from a sneeze can travel 2 to 4 metres!

Wash your hands for at least 20 seconds before you eat, after going to the toilet and after coughing and sneezing.




DETECT


